<p>Recovery Grants</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• In addition to state grants, the Federal Government will provide additional grants.• Businesses and organisations that have sustained damage as a result of the fires can access up to \$50,000 in grant funding (tax free).• These are available to eligible small businesses that have sustained damage as a result of the fires. This includes both businesses that have burned down and those that have lost stock as a result of power outages. <p>Australian Government Disaster Recovery Payment (AGDRP)</p> <p>The AGDRP provides a one-off payment of \$1,000 per eligible adult and \$400 per eligible child.</p> <p>According to the government, it is available for people who have been seriously injured, have lost their homes or whose homes have been directly damaged. <p>Disaster Recovery Allowance (DRA)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Disaster Recovery Allowance (DRA) is a short-term income support payment to assist individuals who can show that their income has been affected because of a disaster. • The DRA assists employees, small business persons and farmers who experience a loss of income as a direct result of a major disaster. • The DRA provides income support payments for up to 13 weeks, up to the applicable rate of Newstart or Youth Allowance, depending on your circumstances. • Applicants for funding may be required to show they lost income because of the fires. • The DRA is open to Australian residents who are at least 16 years old, but not to anyone who already receives another income support payment or pension. 	<p>National – Federal Government</p>	<p>Visit the Department of Human Services website: www.humanservices.gov.au/individuals/help-emergency/bushfires to see if your local government area is on the list for assistance.</p>

<p>Disaster Recovery Allowance Short-term payment for a maximum of 13 weeks for people who have lost income as a direct result of the bushfires. The Disaster Recovery Allowance is a taxable payment to people 16 years or older at the time of the fire and earn less than the average weekly income in the weeks after you had this income loss. If you are eligible to receive the Disaster Recovery Allowance you might be able to access Beneficiary Tax Offset. <p>Cashflow support for eligible small businesses to run their operations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Loans of up to \$500,000 will be offered for businesses that have suffered significant asset loss or a significant loss of revenue. The loan would be for up to 10 years and used for the purposes of restoring or replacing damaged assets and for working capital. The loans will be available with a repayment holiday of up to two years, with no interest accruing during this period. <p>Loans available</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 2.83% p.a. three-year variable rate, rebuilding loans for business customers, up to \$1 million individual loans (\$1 billion allocation). No foreclosures for three years on any farming businesses in the affected areas.
